We have just completed our DRA (Developmental Reading Assessment) and are excited to report that our students have grown in their reading Students abilities. have learned and are using their reading strategies as well as comprehending they have read as evident in their retelling of the stories. We have also seen growth in their recognition of sight words and their ability to decode unknown words by using letter sounds.

In mathematics we have been working hard on addition subtraction. and Students have been given many opportunities to explore these concepts through the of manipulatives use and word problems to practice in these new areas. We also will review material that we covered throughout the year.

We would like to thank our parents for all of their support and help with student homework, sight word contracts, and at-home browser boxes. We could not have advanced the students as far without your help! As the school year winds down, we still encourage you to read with your child everyday!

First Grade

The first graders have been working very hard this reading, month. In focused on retelling stories, makina connections. identifying main ideas and supporting details. and developing fluency. Students have also been busy in math adding, subtracting, and problem solving. Continue to practice math facts at home to develop automatic recall. We enjoyed an in school enrichment activity about farming called Farm Mobile. Students learned about what foods come from farms and the different food groups. In science, we have enjoyed the magical journey of the butterfly. The children have watched as our caterpillars transformed into chrysalides and then butterflies. We will be releasing them into nature soon. June 4 is our school wide carnival. Our grade level will looking for cake cupcake donations for our scrumptious cakewalk. Α notice will be coming home soon. Grade 1 is preparing for our field trip to Beardsley Park Zoo on June 9. Please be sure to send back permission slips. Second Grade

The Second Graders have been working making connections to a character's feeling. Students have read stories and passages made a connection to how any of the characters in the story are feeling. Students have been working on using more 'interesting' feeling instead of 'boring' words feeling words. Some 'boring' feeling words include: happy, sad, mad, surprised. Students have a Feeling Chart in their desk and a poster of the same chart on the wall to help them 'interesting' use more feeling word instead.

In Science, we have been learning about Weather and the Water Cycle. Second Grade we learn about Evaporation, Precipitation, Condensation, and Collection, within the Water Cycle process. Students also should be able to describe to you about Cumulus, Cirrus, and Stratus clouds. Can your child name you the different types of precipitation?

In Math have we begun working on multiplying and dividing numbers using arrays and pictures. Students have worked with tiles and other math manipulatives to show their array on their desks. You have probably seen the arrays coming home as math homework. In Second Grade, multiplication is introduced as repeated addition. Make sure you keep practicing those Math facts at home, students are expected to know all their addition and subtraction math facts up to 18 by the end of the year.

Third Grade

The 2009/10 school year is quickly coming to an end! It's a time to think and reflect about your child's year in third grade. Just think... in 40 weeks or 180 school days or 900 school hours (that's taking out recess, lunch, and special), your child is leaving as a stronger reader, writer, and thinker. But let's not forget! With all our strengths... come weaknesses.

During the summer, make sure your child continues to read and write daily. Practice math facts and strengthen those problem solving skills.

Students are **reading** short biographies and learning to record journal entries as well as include ideas in a speech. During the past three weeks, students have been practicing these skills. addition, many students have been working in small groups to increase fluency by using expression and paying attention to punctuation.

In math, students finished a unit on place value. Now, they are learning about perimeter and area, capacity, and weight. Ask your child to define these concepts for you.

In writing, we are reviewing how to write a fictional narrative. Remember...write a **Bang of a Beginning**, an Action Packed Middle and a Strong Ending. Our last prompt will be given in two weeks. Keep Writing!

On May 28th, the third grades are going to Les' for an ice cream celebration. We would like to thank Miss Wilson for planning and organizing the trip!

On June 11th, the third grades will be visiting the Norwalk Maritime Center. Students can't wait! We would like to thank Mrs. Higley for planning and organizing the trip to the aquarium!

Kindergarteners are supporting some of their academic goals on the computer by learning more about color words, and the manipulation of shapes.

First graders extended this idea of the manipulation of shapes by exploring different triangles, and recognizing that because they still had 3 straight sides and 3 angles, they were still triangles! They also made some calendars.

Second graders finished their PowerPoint creations reflecting what they learned about their city of Meriden. They are also extending the idea that even though shapes can move through space by flipping, turning and sliding, they retain their shape identification and name.

Third graders learned that they created once one calendar in Excel, they could use that one as a starting point for a calendar for another month. The power of the computer became more real for a lot of students! With that existing knowledge of Excel, they are displaying what they have been learning about Mexican holidays. Just like many people in the USA celebrate national holidays like Independence Day, Memorial Day and Presidents' Day, other countries celebrate their own national holidays, too.

Fourth graders are taking the results from a survey and turning them into a graph in Excel.

Fifth graders are taking a themselves, picture of removing the background, and placing themselves in a different space like DC, France, or even outer space! They have а better

understanding of why people question photographs that are seen in the weekly magazines in the grocery stores!!



Math Minute

The Roger Sherman Math Team

Students in all grades are coming to an end of their math studies for their current grade as the end of the year approaches. Kindergarten will complete the year by studying Sharing and Grouping of objects.

In first grade teachers will explore the challenging concept of problem solving.

Second graders will finish the year looking at concepts of multiplication and division while also exploring place value of numbers through the hundreds.

To complete the year in third grade, students will study algebraic reasoning and work on increasing their fluency in multiplication.

Fourth grade finishes the year with a review unit after they work on higher concepts of fractions.

The fifth grade students finish elementary math their experience with harder concepts of measurement such as, angles, and also a review unit that better for the prepares them beginning of 6th grade math.

Students in grades 2, 3, & 4 will receive a summer math packet to keep their skills sharp over the long vacation.
