Second graders participated in their own Constitutional Convention on September 17<sup>th</sup>, to celebrate Constitution Day. Each classroom represented a different state that was present at the Convention in 1787. The classes paraded around the school on their way to Independence Hall (aka: the gym). There, they created a Second grade Constitution which was signed by the delegates from each classroom.

<u>Kindergarten-</u> Students are working with numbers 0-5, and focusing on recognizing letters, their sounds, and listening for rhyme. They are practicing how to form letters and how to write letters to match the sounds in words. Sight words (a, my, I, like, yes, no, the) have been introduced. Our Kindergarten Homework Meeting in October will be scheduled shortly and a notice will be coming home.

<u>First Grade-</u> First Graders are learning about using their schema when listening to or reading a story. We are working on our first 60 sight words. In Math we are graphing and identifying patterns. In Writing we are focusing on writing complete sentences with correct punctuation and capitalization.

Second Grade-In second grade, we have been learning about Reader's and Writer's workshop and how to read in our book nooks. We are practicing our editing in writing and will begin writing descriptive paragraphs. We learned about the Constitution in Social Studies. In math, we have been practicing addition and subtraction strategies.

Third Grade-During the month of September, students have learned the rules and expectations in each class. Reading and Writing Workshop were introduced and guided reading groups have begun. In math, we reviewed numbers and analyzed tables and graphs. Please make sure your child reads and practices spelling words every evening.

<u>Fourth Grade</u>- Fourth graders are immersed in their author study-Roald Dahl! We are reading the book *The Witches*. In math, we are working on adding and subtracting 3-4 digit numbers and problem solving. Our Social Studies unit is on the state of Connecticut. We are preparing for learning by practicing our map skills: reading keys and a compass rose as well as using scales to measure distances.

Fifth Grade-Grade Five has started the DARE Program. We have been learning to make appropriate, respectful decisions in all situations. Officer Ganter and Officer Phillips have been working with us. We are looking forward to learning about the effects drugs and alcohol have, and how violence could change our lives. We will make choices to avoid drugs and violence!
